## End of Term Arrangements

As the end of term is approaching, I am contacting parents to confirm the arrangements. Our on-site provision for vulnerable students and those of key workers, and our Year 10 support programme will end on **Friday 17th July**. If your child has been attending the key worker provision and this is essential for you on either Monday 20th or Tuesday 21st July, then please contact Sally Truscott to discuss the supervision needs for your children and how we can help.

Our school staff will be working on Monday 20th and Tuesday 21st July preparing for September. We have substantial adaptations to make to our classrooms, site and procedures and these days will be extremely helpful for our preparations and for staff training. In addition, we will be arranging end of term remote assemblies for students via Google Classrooms and we hope that your child will be able to participate.

Our phone lines will remain open until **2.30pm on Tuesday 21st**. After this time, pastoral staff and school leaders remain contactable via email. If your child is in Year 11 and eagerly awaiting the exam results, these will be sent out to students via post on **Thursday 20th August**. With regret, the school site is not open to students on results day this year. School staff will be on hand to provide support and advice to students on Thursday 20th and Friday 21st August.
