What is my child studying this half term?

You will find a range of information about what your child is studying via the curriculum section of our website. This includes:

These are one page sheets that contain all the information that your child is expected to know by the end of the unit of work for each subject. For example, core knowledge and facts, subject-specific vocabulary, and key diagrams. These knowledge organisers are also designed to help to support your child’s revision at home, self-quizzing and their homework. Hopefully, they will also support parents with learning conversations at home with their child.
- **A new ‘5-year learning pathways’ section** of the website: [Learning Pathways - Hayle Academy](#). These pathways show the 5 year spiral curriculum for each subject in a clear and visual way, so that you can see what your child is studying at Hayle Academy over their time with us.
- The last curriculum letter outlined the ambition of the whole-school curriculum: its aim, rationale and structure. Global Values

As you will be aware, we have embedded ‘Global Values’ across the school to facilitate the delivery of:

We do ask that your child brings to school each day their reading book as part of their equipment list and returns their loaned book to the library within the set scale of 3 books in 3 weeks.
