- Our Year 11 students have really impressed with their conduct through their first mock exam series. They have also been busy with their post-16 applications and work experience interviews. ## Last day of term

As a reminder to all parents and carers, our term ends for students on **Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> December**. Students can wear non-school uniform on this day, although please ensure that all clothing is appropriate for school. For example, cropstyle tops are not permitted.

We propose our traditional end of year arrangement, with a shorter day for students. All students will be able to have lunch and will have a final farewell with their tutor group before departing school at 13:00. At the start of the day, students will have the chance to take part in celebratory House assemblies, including the House Point auction and '12 days of Christmas' attendance prize draws, centred around positive engagement in school and learning.

However, **if your child accesses the county bus or taxi transport service**, these buses/ taxis are unable to collect at an earlier time and will remain available at 15:05pm. If your child remains on site, they will remain supervised in an IT room until the end of the day.

Please note, if your child accesses the school's own Camborne mini bus service, the mini bus will transport students home at the earlier time of 13:00.

## January 2024 return to school

Just a reminder that we look forward to welcoming students back to school after the Christmas break on **Monday 8<sup>th</sup> January 2024** at the normal time. Students will return on Week 1 of their timetable.

Please note that the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> January are training days for staff with a particular focus on our continued preparations for our digital transformation strategy as we get ready for the staggered introduction of ipads for each child to enhance students' learning, starting with Year 7 in February and Year 10 at Easter. This is an exciting development for our school; further information will be available early in the Spring term.

Students have now signed up for their Spring Broad Horizons offer. The **first Broad Horizons Spring session will start on the afternoon of Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> January** and fortnightly from that point.

- Save the date: we are holding our **open classroom event for Year 9 and Year 10 students on Tuesday 23**<sup>rd</sup> **January 2024**. Parents and carers will have the opportunity to meet their child's teacher in their classroom, review their child's work and discuss their progress without the need for an appointment. This will also enable Year 9 parents and carers with their child to explore possible **option choices** with their teachers as part of this decision-making process. Please note that our open classroom events coupled with targeted phone calls and meetings, replace the traditional parents' evening for Years 7-10. The open classroom event for Years 7 and 8 will take place early in the Summer term.

As we move into December, students will be continuing their learning in each subject and I would like to thank all our students in advance for continuing to work hard and focus right until the very end.
