### **Apprenticeships**

Following on from September's newsletter, I have some more invaluable information and resources for apprenticeship applications – apprenticeships are really taking off, with more vacancies than ever before and more support available to help students find their dream career path!

Did you know that you can even take an apprenticeship to become a doctor!!

#### Three Ways to Find an Apprenticeship

## 1: The Speculative Search

- Write a skills-based CV and a Cover Letter
- Research local employers who you want to work for, find out the name of the manager/Human Resource details and email your CV and cover letter to them. Or call the office and schedule a meeting/call with the manager.
- Ask people you know to find out if their employer offers vacancies
- If a business doesn't have an apprenticeship scheme but are interested in setting one up, give them these links it's easy and the local colleges will help:
  - o Employing an Apprentice Cornwall College
  - Apprenticeships Truro & Penwith College

## 2: Advertised vacancies

• Use job websites and employer websites and apply for any vacancies

#### 3: College apprenticeships

Look at apprenticeship vacancies on your local college websites and apply directly

## **Top Tips!**

- Start looking for apprenticeships now the closer you get to summer the more opportunities will be advertised, so keep looking!
- Sign up to apprenticeship vacancy alerts with colleges and apprenticeship websites
- Use LinkedIn (if you're over 16) or the company website to find out names of managers and HR so you can speak to them directly
- Practice your interview techniques
- Research how to complete an application form properly
- Get writing your CV now!

#### How to write a CV

- The best type of CV to use when leaving school is a skills based CV. This format emphasises skills that match the job you're applying for rather than relying on work experience
- You should tailor your CV to the position you're applying for by including skills and examples that are relevant.
- Use the job description to identify key buzz words and include these on your CV


