Broad Horizons Enrichment Curriculum

We are delighted to be able to share our Broad Horizons offer for Summer 2025 so that there are even more fabulous enrichment activities to take part in. All students will participate in a 'collapsed timetable' opportunity every Thursday Week A, period 4 as part of the normal school day.



Students will get involved in exciting opportunities to develop health and wellbeing, develop new and exciting skills, and to support the community.



Whether it is angling or art, golfing or gardening, forensics or bushcraft skills, there really will be fantastic opportunities for everyone at the school.





Broad Horizons will take place every Thursday Week A. For the Summer Term, this will be:



- 24th April
- 8th and 22nd May
- 12th and 26th June
- 10th July



Students will attend school in their full school uniform or full school PE kit. If specialist clothing is required, students will need to change into these during the lunch break if directed by their session leader. Activities will take place in all weathers so some waterproof clothing may be advisable for some activities!



Lunchtimes will be slightly adjusted to give the maximum time for each activity. All students will have their lunch between 12.50-13.30 with activities running from 13.30-15.05.



We will expect the usual high standards of behaviour from all students. Students will be rewarded during the sessions using the house point system. Any incidents of poor behaviour will be managed following the school behaviour protocols. Groups are not allocated according to friendship to encourage students to work with a range of people across different year groups.



We aim for all students to be able to do one of their chosen activities and will inform students of allocations as soon as possible. Activities do vary throughout the year.

Year 11

As a supportive measure, we are offering all Year 11s the option to complete one of the following three activities in the lead up to their GCSE examinations. All Year 11s will need to select one of these activities.



Exam Support: Mindfulness, wellbeing and stress busting activities prior to exam time



Fit for Life: Use of the fitness suite to support mental and physical wellbeing



Personal Study: An opportunity to revise and complete work at your own pace.

Activity	Staff	Location	What do you need to know?
Golf	RRA	West Cornwall Golf Club	A fantastic opportunity to experience golf and refine skills using the facilities at the fantastic West Cornwall Golf Club. Each week would consist of going to West Cornwall Golf Club and having coaching sessions with one of the club PGA professionals. The opportunity to experience golf as a complete beginner, or refine existing skills. Once we have developed our skills on the practice facilities we will then venture out onto the main course for some match play. This is open to all abilities and to those that are keen to try a new sport. Please note there is a £45* cost for this course.
Trail Running	ABL	Room 43 / offsite in various locations using school minibus transport	Trail running is a sport that combines running and hiking over natural terrain. It emphasizes endurance, agility, and a connection with nature. This will be an all-weather activity and will involve offsite running on tough terrain. A sturdy pair of trainers required and a love of rain and mud advised!

Swimming for Beginners	THO	Room 7 / St Ives Leisure Centre using school minibus transport	We feel that being able to confidently swim a minimum of 50 metres is a crucial life skill and supporting our students to do this is one of our Hayle 365 offers . Students who wish to take up this offer will be in a small group and will work with Mrs Hosking to develop their confidence and ability in the water. During this course, there will also be a session based on beach safety and recognising dangerous swimming conditions. Swimming kit is required. This activity is only suitable for students who cannot swim 50 metres.
Psychology 101	SVB	Room 26	What makes people tick? Why do some people behave the way they do? Why do different things affect your mood and confidence? If you've ever spent time thinking about these puzzles, psychology might be for you. Psychology is the scientific study of the mind and human behaviour. Psychologists observe and conduct experiments to find out more about the way people act and interact. Students who choose this should be interested in this area of scientific study.

World of Books	MRI	Library	Immerse yourself in a world of books, travel to far off lands or back in time and enjoy reading for pleasure.
Short Story Writing	IHA	Room 8	This will give students a chance to use their creative writing skills and create a booklet of 3 short stories that they will perfect and redraft. Students will then create the booklet or 'collection' , along with illustrations and a biography section.
Cycling for Beginners	GHA	Room 28/Outside	We feel that being able to confidently ride a bike is a valuable life skill and supporting our students to do this is one of our Hayle 365 offers . Students who wish to take up this offer will be in a small group and will work with our external provider, Sustrans, alongside Mr. Hanner to develop their confidence and ability to ride a bike. During this course, there will also be a focus upon road and cycle safety. This activity is only suitable for students who cannot already confidently ride a bike

Each session will involve various aspects of forensic skills and criminal law that will build you into the budding young forensic scientist.</p> <p>This activity is for KS3 only.</p>
Beginners Bushcraft	LWE/ ZPE	Room 1/Towans /Offsite	<p>Develop your survival skills in this beginners bushcraft course. Students will complete this all- weather course and have the opportunity to try outdoor camp cooking, den building, tent erection. Please note, this is for KS3 students only.</p>
Strate-gems!	JHE	Room 42	<p>Spend time developing your strategic thinking through activities such as Chess, Go and Cluedo. The power of thinking in this way helps to develop your problem solving ability.</p>

Football Coaching and Skills	ESA	Room 10 / Outside	This is perfect for any students interested in taking a more active role in grassroots football. By the end of this course, you'll be able to confidently support fun, safe and inclusive football sessions . This is both a theory and practical course . Students will need their iPad and full PE kit to participate.
Harbourwise	HEM	Hayle Harbour/ Offsite	Back by popular demand! The Hayle Harbourwise programme is run by the Deputy Harbour Master of Hayle Harbour and she always has lots of amazing and informative activities in store! This year the course will begin with an Introduction to Hayle Harbour, followed by a fun location scavenger hunt. There will also be opportunities for students to develop their navigation with Ben Granata from H2O Safety, and the Devon and Cornwall Police Marine Unit will be showcasing some of their equipment!

Students do participate in all weathers so some sensible footwear and waterproofs recommended.
The Great Beach Clean	MLE	Offsite at local beaches	This is an opportunity to take care of our local environment with positive community action on our stunning Cornish coast. Each session we'll visit different sections of the coastline and remove any potential marine plastic pollution. This section could be perfect for your volunteering section of your Duke of Edinburgh Award too! You'll need to come equipped with sunscreen and a hat . We'll provide the litter pickers and bags. We will walk to some locations.
